Dear Parents and Caregivers,

MANDATE LETTER - GOD IS EXPERIENCED TODAY IN WAYS REVEALED BY JESUS CHRIST

Jesus inaugurated this Kingdom during his ministry in Israel. Its influence grows as more people believe in him and accept Baptism. Its final climax and fulfilment will be realised only on the Last Day in the universe, when he will come again.

Human beings today accept the experiences of divine power Jesus revealed—the power of the Kingdom—into their lives by converting to Jesus personally, and by believing and following him in their daily lives. This power is the basic Christian promise of Salvation. It is the 'Good News' of salvation.

The first people to whom Jesus Christ communicated these experiences of his Kingdom were his Apostles. The experiences have been handed down ever since to each generation through the Church, the community in which Jesus remains as Head.

This Sunday is the 29th Sunday of Ordinary Time. Sunday's Gospel has a most important lesson for us about God's law. Laws are very important. Laws protect people. They tell us, for example that we may not drive at a dangerous speed. But laws do not just tell us what we may not do. They also point out the things that are good and important. The speed limits, for example, teach us that safety is more important than speed. They teach us to drive with care.

When we understand the meaning of laws, we are more able to follow family rules, school rules and the laws of our country. We are more able to follow the law of God. We can also begin to understand Sunday's Gospel.

Listen to the words of Matthew 22: 35-40.

An expert in the Jewish Law tried to test Jesus by asking, "Teacher, what is the most important commandment in the Law?"

Jesus answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind. This the first and most important commandment. The second most important commandment is like this one. And it is, 'Love others as much as you love yourself.' All the Law of Moses and the Books of the Prophets are based on these two commandments."


